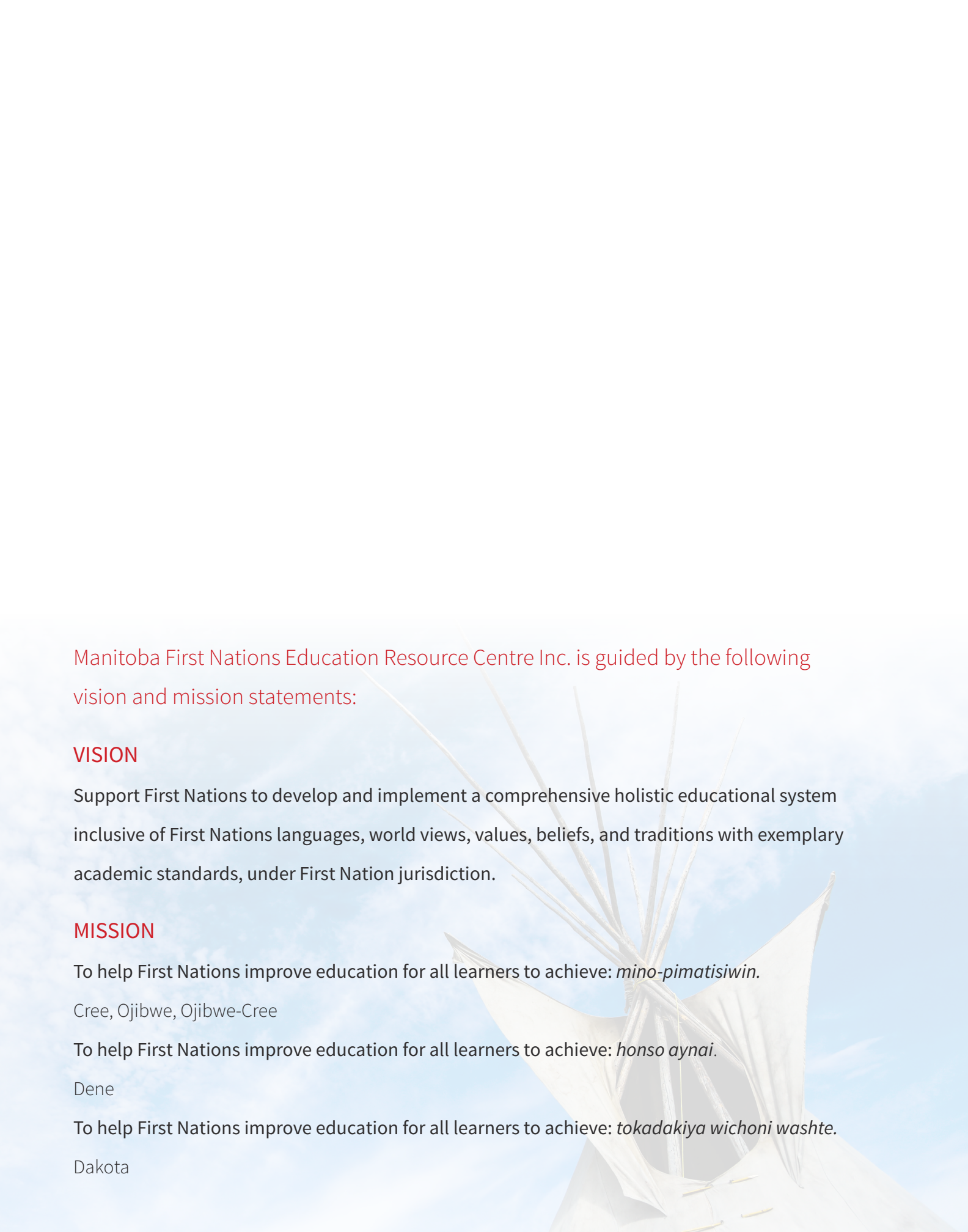

Where is York Factory First Nation?

York Factory First Nation is nestled along the eastern bank of the Nelson River in Manitoba. The community is (175km) east of Thompson and (937 km) north of Winnipeg.

Service Centres

York Factory First Nation is a remote community. Ilford is (34km) east and Split Lake is (31km) north on a winter road. There is limited access using the ferries in the summer months and the ice road in the winter.
